Camp Volunteer – Jordan

Attending his first SU camp at the age of 10, Jordan has always enjoyed the adventure and Christian community that SU camps bring.

Keen to lead and serve on camps, Jordan heard of the opportunity to be an intern with SU camping ministry. Jordan's internship was a year of encouragement and growth.

"God worked through me, enlarging my capacity and capabilities. With my interactions with students and teachers, I have been able to show through SU that people really care. We share our faith but also our life as well."

Now working as part of the school camping team, Jordan shares, "It is so encouraging seeing the positive way young people are impacted by their time on camps." Jordan's experience with SU Camps inspired him to be an intern at Camp Geographe, learning all the practical skills that go into running a camp.



School Chaplain – Deema

Every SU Australia chaplain brings a passion for caring for others' needs and qualities that God has placed on their heart for their communities.

Deema, chaplain at two Sydney-based schools, loves connecting with people across cultures. "Both schools I work at have different needs and cultures, and coming from Sri Lanka, I'm really passionate about multiculturalism. I know how important it is to be culturally aware and sensitive."

Deema met a family who'd recently moved from the Congo. She connected them with someone who could teach basic English. Then when the mother and unborn fifth baby tragically died from an aneurysm, Deema was called on to help once again. The school community and a local church rallied to help cover the funeral costs and so much more at the time, while Deema remained a key support person through this difficult time. Deema is now a facilitator of CHAT (Culturally Hearing Asking Telling), and is looking forward to incorporating this program into her schools.



Church & Community Partnership

SU has partnered with Launceston Alive and churches since 2017 to run a fun-filled day to celebrate the joy of Easter at the Children and Families Festival.

Each year the celebration has grown, now reaching almost 4,000 people, with over 40 churches contributing to the festival. The aim of the event is to unify local Christians, churches and multicultural communities, while also sharing the message of Easter with the wider community.

"So many people have been encouraged and delighted by the way SU has catalysed the cohesion of churches in Northern Tasmania ... with progressively more churches cooperating in bringing to children and families this vibrant celebration of Easter," says David Strong, Chair of the Launceston Alive Steering Committee.

Partnering with churches and other Christian organisations, such as City Mission or the Bible Society, provides a great opportunity to enjoy fun activities as part of the celebrations. It also enables engaging conversations with locals about the good news of the Easter story.
